





PIB (Crecimiento anual en %)




PIB per Capita (\$)













- Additional Financial Act (AFA)
 - Foreign companies can acquire any algerian counterpart except in strategic sectors and purchase and resale activities.
 - Foreign companies will now be able to finance their investments through loans provided by foreign banks.
 - Renewable energies, infrastructure (4G or Optic fiber), hospitality, agriculture, automobile industry, etc.




Distribution channels by sector
